21/207: Apologies for Absence

Councillors Mary Carey, Sue Sternberg and Stephen Day, County Councillor Juliette Ash (J. Ash)

21/208: Declarations of interest: None

21/209: Public questions and statements: No members of the public were in attendance.

21/210: Reports from District and County Councillors:

Oxfordshire County Council (OCC)

J. Ash sent a report. See Attachment 1.

Vale of White Horse District Council (VoWHDC)

- J. Avery sent a report. See Attachment 2.
- J. Avery noted that Hinton Waldrist Parish Council will be sending an e-mail of support to Fyfield and Tubney Parish Council with regards to the boundary change. The council noted it had sent an expression of support to them.

The council asked J. Avery if he could contribute any funds to the Queen's Jubilee celebrations. J. Avery will come back to the council with an answer in 2 weeks.

21/211: Minutes of the last meeting: To authorise the signing of the minutes of the Parish Council Meeting of 10th January 2022 as a true record.

21/212: Matters arising from the previous meetings and not appearing elsewhere on the agenda: None

21/213: Clerk's Report: The council acknowledged the Clerk's Report.

21/214: Pre-school: LG reported that she has been approached by someone who is interested in getting a pre-school started again in Appleton. LG asked her to come back to the council once they have a proposal.

21/215: Appleton with Eaton Map: The History Group has proposed a map of the parish of Appleton with Eaton with a possibly placement near the War Memorial. The council support this idea in principle, and think it an excellent plan for the Jubilee year.

The PC will await further information and quotes before they can discuss any help towards the expenditure.

21/216: Speed: The council discussed the recent speed data. AS reported that 75% of the traffic are under 20mph, and 99% of the remaining 25% is under 30mph. The council asked AL to check with J. Ash to see what she has found out about cost of changing the speed limit to 20mph. If there is no cost involved, the council would like to proceed. IF there is a cost, the council will add this to an agenda for discussion.

AL noted she has been in touch with OCC regarding the transitionary speed limit between Oaksmere and Tubney Manor. She will continue to follow up with them to get a site visit.

Other options discussed in this area were a sign at the bend and possible road markings extending further letting drivers know a 30mph zone is coming up.

21/217: Climate Change:

- Oxfordshire Treescape Project: It was discussed that the council will look to Green Appleton for an update.
- It was also reported that there is a possibility of a tree being planted at the sportsfield.
- It was also reported that J. Ash is willing to donate Jubilee roses to the council on behalf of OCC. She is in touch with the Gardening Society and these will most likely be planted in Jubilee Park.

21/218: War Memorial Repair: It was reported that MC, TB and AL had met with a stone mason about moving the steps and path of the memorial to the side in order to avoid future damage. APPC are happy with this and AL has received one quote and is waiting for some more.

21/219: Platinum Jubilee: LG reported that the following plan has been generally agreed for the Queen's Jubilee weekend:

Day 1: Cubs and Scouts: Lighting of a beacon-provosional at this stage

Day 2:

- Bellringing at church
- Livestreaming of the Service of Thanksgiving from St Paul's Cathedral

Day 3: Village Hall open for displays by the History Society and WI (possibly the Gardening Society)

Day 4: Big Lunch which will be held using the barn and South Lawn back garden depending on the weather , followed by a cricket match at the sportsfield later in the afternoon.

There will be music at the lunch which is being decided on. There will also be a children's entertainer and games/sideshows/fairground rides

It was noted that sponsorship may be needed.

Covid-19

Rising cases in the County.

The numbers show cases in Oxfordshire have **increased by 25 per cent over the past week**, with a particularly sharp rise in children. Face coverings are now no longer legally required in most indoor places as Plan B restrictions come to an end. However, **Ansaf Azhar, OCC Director of Public Health**, has advised people to remain cautious in the wake of rising cases and has urged everyone to <u>continue to take sensible precautions</u> – wearing a face covering in indoor public areas, taking regular tests, ventilating spaces and washing hands regularly.

Road safety. Twenty's plenty scheme.

Wallingford Central has become the third of the 20mph pilot schemes in Oxfordshire. The work was completed in Jan and I continue to be in favour of our villages introducing a 20mph limit where suitable and when supported by local residents.

I have now supported applications for around half of our villages. The majority have selected specific roads whilst a couple have requested that the whole village move to 20mph. Please get in touch if your village is interested in signing up for the scheme.

South East Strategic Reservoir proposal.

I have been liaising with colleagues at the County Council regarding serious objections that we have and that we continue to hear from residents over this enormous proposal from Thames Water. It is hugely concerning that it is being proposed again in the same form despite multiple objectives over the many years that it has been considered.

I will be meeting with both Members of Parliament and other Cllrs this month to discuss our concerns.

In addition, a number of public meetings will be taking place over Feb and you are welcome to attend them to have your say.

Oxford United (OU) request land near Kidlington for a new stadium

OU Football Club has requested land to develop a new 18,000-capacity football stadium, with linked leisure and commercial facilities, on land owned by OCC near Kidlington. The club has asked to lease 18 hectares of land at Stratfield Brake for 250 years. Cabinet

discussed the proposal at its meeting on 18 January. You can <u>read more</u> about the proposal online.

Several residents have already been in touch from our divison to support the proposal and I am interested to hear from others. I am broadly supportive of the scheme for the health, well-being and commercial benefits that it would bring whilst making sure any negative effects for residents, such as parking capacity, are carefully mitigated against in the proposals.



ATTACHMENT 2:

Proposed Boundary Change



Fyfield & Tubney PC is quite rightly very concerned that the above change will be approved and that Kingston Bagpuize is treating the proposed change "as a done deal." Further to that, the area of land to the east of Kingston is the same piece of land that Lioncourt is keen to acquire as the site to build some 660 new houses. The company has already submitted two applications to date and both have been rejected by the Planning Committee in the

light of very serious concerns being expressed in relation to AQMA (Air Quality Management) issues ivo Marcham and the failure of Lioncourt to meet the condition to pay sufficient S106 funding to meet the cost of necessary road improvements.

Fyfield and Tubney PC has understandably views the proposed development as a test case and has called for my support in opposing the acquisition of the above piece of land by Kingston. I am fully in sympathy with Fyfield in this matter and will argue strongly against any change to the existing parish boundaries.

Road Safety

All PCs within Thames Ward have expressed their well-founded concerns with respect to road safety not only in relation to the A 420 but also as far the network of minor roads is concerned. As matters stand, a number of measures have already beem implemented by parishes, namely the installation of SIDs (Speed Indication Devices) which not only interact with drivers by warning them that the limit has been exceeded but also record all individual instances of speeding. From the standpoint of working with The Highways Authority this is important because that body rightly needs clear and incontrovertible proof to be presented to it before we can advance the cause of "20 is plenty." In villages, a further problem is that of parking on roads that are very narrow and with verges that are often overgrown.

With reference to road safety matters affecting the wider area which includes Thames Ward, FATAC (Faringdon Area Traffic Advisory Committee) held its last meeting on 17 Dec 2021 and at that meeting proposed that a safety working group be set up and led by Oxfordshire County Council. The key part of their remit would be to look ways of improving road safety on the A 420.

Oxford - Cambridge ARC Proposal

Thames Ward PCs are not alone in expressing real concern about the OxCam Economic Growth proposal. A conference on the subject is to be held on 24/25 January 2022 and the speakers will seek to advance the cause whilst ignoring the concerns of local people who have always opposed the proposed scheme. In a sample survey, 9 out 10 people were absolutely opposed to the ARC scheme that inter alia would involve building 1m new houses by 2050 and the creation of a high-tech zone across 5 counties. Of course, and perhaps inevitably there have been many unanswered questions as to developers wanting to use greenfield sites rather brownfield sites. Local democracy would, of course, be threatened as the powers of local authorities would be diminished. Further to that, climate change and environmental issues are not addressed and there is vagueness as to the actual boundaries of any development. Of course, I have acquainted you all wrt to these matters in much greater detail in previous updates.
