I have the following two points to bring to your attention from a ward perspective:-

1. A presentation by Cumnor PC stating in detail very real concerns in relation to the Botley Solar Farm proposal. The link to that presentation is below.

Cumnor PC would very much appreciate letters supporting their stance from all neighbouring PCs.

2. Voicing objections to the Lioncourt application to build 700 homes on land east of Kingston Bagpuize.

The application will be heard before the Planning Committee on 14 Feb '23 and the Chair of Fyfield & Tubney PC has stated that he will be speaking against the application on the grounds as follows:-

- The VoWHC appears not to be working to protect and represent the local residents as evidenced by:
- All local PCs are objecting but their objections have been ignored.
- Key considerations are simply not dealt with by the officers' 71-page report.
- The fact that housing need in Oxon has been reduced as evidenced by the delay of the Dalton Barracks scheme
- The traffic impact on adjacent roads such as the A420 which is one of the most dangerous roads in England is not even mentioned
- In a disingenuous manner the traffic impact is presented as being fully addressed by the now approved Frilford Lights improvements points to note in relation to this:-
- a. Once again, all adjacent PCs objected on the basis it does not present the optimum solution for the issue and this was ignored.
 - b. The Committee approved the scheme despite the fact it acknowledged it was "half baked."

d. The fact that the VoWHC officers appear to simply be endorsing the analyses presented by the biased developer's consultants without independent analysis -this puts in

question whether due process has been followed.

In addition to the above points, I would also mention a key objection raised originally, namely failure to address the air quality management issue in relation to Marcham.

GENERAL OCC REPORT

COUNCIL BUDGET FOR 23/24

OCC has received an unexpectedly generous Local Government Settlement which has resulted in the council having a surplus of £9m relative to the draft budget that has been out for public consultation. However, rather than use this surplus to cut Council Tax and reduce the payment burden on residents or improve Adult social care or SEN provision, disappointingly, the administration is looking for ways to spend the money.



The Budget will be debated and voted upon by Full Council on 14 February. I am particularly concerned about OCC monies being used to fund advertising in Buckinghamshire (photo-

Aylesbury Tesco, 8/1/23), which is outside of the remit of OCC and am calling on the administration to focus their efforts on road safety and repairs in our own county.

OCC CABINET APPROVES CONTINUED STADIUM DISCUSSIONS WITH OXFORD UNITED

OCC's cabinet has authorised its officers to start negotiations with Oxford United FC on outline legal and commercial terms relating to the club's proposal to lease land for the development of a new football stadium. Discussions to secure information and undertakings that meet OCC's objectives will continue. Any final decision regarding the leasing of the land will be taken in public by a future cabinet meeting, based on whether the council's objectives have been met.

PROPOSAL FOR GIANT RESERVOIR FACES CONTINUED OPPOSITION

Renewed efforts by water companies to move forward with proposals for a giant reservoir near East Hanney and Steventon are continually being contested by all Cllrs. OCC's cabinet discussed its draft responses to a series of consultations taking place concerning future water supplies, including the Water Resources South East (WRSE) draft regional plan. The WRSE plan includes proposals for a reservoir located between Abingdon, East Hanney, Steventon and Marcham, which would hold up to 100 million cubic metres of water - known as the South East Strategic Reservoir Option (SESRO) – as well as other options for securing future water supply. In the council's draft response, the WRSE consultation is described as "deeply flawed" and based on "unrealistic and non-evidence-based assumptions" about climate change, as well as "ludicrously outdated population projections". The response calls the £1.244 billion reservoir "a destructive scheme, both environmentally and in its impacts on local people", with bill-payers effectively being asked to "sign a blank cheque", with no clear cost-benefit analysis or justification. I will continue to oppose this scheme on behalf of residents in its current form as although there is a small minority that is not against the scheme on the grounds that a smaller version could bring associated leisure benefits, I think there are other ways to deliver such benefits and crucially the water supply required without building such a mammoth structure in our Countryside.

ROAD SAFETY: A420

Having proposed the cross-party meeting to support improvements in road safety along the full stretch of the A420, I met with officers and called again for a data driven approach to solutions and a full review of the current accident stats and their causes.

Officers are currently responding to this request for data and a preliminary level of analysis and presentation will take place this month. Following the review the current list of proposed improvements will be prioritised and additional ones, where possible, added.

- Frilford –reduction in speed limit around one of the A338 junctions confirmed and signed off.
- Fyfield & Tubney investigating possible reduction in speed limit on the A420 in the vicinity of St Lawrence Church in conjunction with the Parish Council Speed surveys have shown that the existing limit is correct for the current 'sign only' restriction. Three requests for infrastructure to improve pedestrian safety have been added to list of potential Accessibility & Road Safety Fund (A&RSF) schemes for the 2023/24 financial year.
- Kingston Bagpuize & Southmoor Zebra crossing on the A415 between Faringdon Road and Oxford Road at CMD approved. Implementation planned for 2023/24 financial year.
- Stanford in the Vale 'School Keep Clear' road markings and a road safety sign have been funded using my Cllr priority funding monies.
