NEW CHAIR OF OCC - COUNCILLOR ALISON ROOKE

As the ceremonial head of the council, the chair must be a serving county councillor but must remain politically impartial. A new chair is elected each May at the annual general meeting of the county council, which this year was on Tuesday 21 May.

This year, the Director of Public Health annual report presents the local impacts of climate change on health and provides a roadmap for how local politicians and decision-makers can act to improve health, look after our environment, and, at the same time, reduce emissions both in Oxfordshire, and nationally.

The black and brown are to demonstrate support for marginalised LGBTIQ+ people of colour, with the triad of blue, pink and white bolstering support for trans communities.
