### Passing on the fruit of the ages!

I'm told that, if you're reading these words, your chances of having been born after 1970 are really very slender. There is a logic to this: those in the late summer of life are likely to be more concerned than their grandchildren about the world to come, and to invest a little attention in the local Church. It has stood at the centre of our community for almost a thousand years, after all: it is just possible that it has learned a thing or two worth passing on.

It's a good time of year to consider these things: February 2nd is the Christian festival of Candlemas: Christmas *finally* ends as we recall old Simeon and Anna recognising in the Jerusalem Temple that this baby Jesus is the light of all the world and the glory of Israel. There is something rather beautiful about this passing-on of the baton by the elderly to the new-born. Like the church, those who have been around for a while have wisdom and experience to share, and it is fitting not just to honour our seniors, but to ask where they got their wisdom from.

For many in villages like ours, a major formative influence was the Church itself. A faith learned in Sunday school and reinforced by hymns sung daily in the school hall, will surely result in a certain moral outlook. Historians like Tom Holland emphasise that our whole European story has been indelibly marked by this Christian inheritance, bearing fruit in fundamental ideas like the absolute dignity of human beings.

It would be grievous to lose habits of 'loving your neighbour as yourself', or 'doing to others as you would that they would do to you'. For many, these habits are best rooted in a belief in God. Now, for many younger families, their belief is lively enough, but their free time is so crammed with kids' sports and shopping trips (and recovering from work), that the annual resolution to make time for Church, that I hear at carol services, can easily come to nothing.

Now, Church doesn't have to be on Sundays. There are other opportunities, especially in school holidays. On the Thursday of half-term, for example, there will

be another 'Messy Church' event in St Laurence's. This is an opportunity to spend time with one's children (of any age) in craft activities, with food and music – while also giving some attention to God and the nurture of our faith. If you have younger relatives and friends who might value a nudge in that direction, do please be that nudge. Bring them along! Details in the text box. Let's not lose what it's taken two millennia to create.

### Appleton History—Barrett's Hill

I guess that not many Appleton folk know the whereabouts of Barrett's Hill. My knowledge comes via oral history – like much of our scraps of knowledge.

It is the gentle hill in Oaksmere; when it leaves Tubney Wood it falls away towards Appleton. The fall is about 25 feet in all when it crosses the Osse Brook.

In the past – when there was little motor traffic – the hill was a playground for our children. Hoops cold be rolled and raced from the top down to the stream; likewise bicycles, tricycles or bogies could be raced. Why its called "Barrett's" seems lost in time- a research project.

Oral history is very important but doubt about its accuracy is often raised. Far away in Australia there is clear and dramatic evidence of its reliability. The First Nation peoples of Australia talk of events some 10,000 years ago; passed down through about 500 generations!

At the end of the last Ice Age much water was locked up around the Earth's poles. Sea levels were very much lower and Australia was a larger land. Tasmania was not an island and northern Australia reached Indonesia and New Guinea.

Australian oral history describes the gradual inflow of the sea as the world warmed. Large areas of land slowly disappeared until it became its modern form. Australia's people have a highly developed tradition of story telling that may explain the recalls of such ancient events.

Roll the pastry into a circle, place the spinach mixture in the centre and crumble feta cheese over it. Fold the pastry over about half of the spinach mixture and then bake.

taking them down! A final and big thank you to Besselsleigh for the pleasure the lights give to so many people and for the much needed funds raised for OHM's projects.


